



Common name: Golden Kelp

Scientific name: Laminaria ochroleuca

It is a highly consumed brown macroalga. Its body is divided into rhizoid - which attaches to the rocky seabed like the roots - a stipe - cylindrical and long as a stem - and the flat blades that come out in a palmate, leaf-like fashion.



To collect them, on foot or by diving in apnea or with air from a boat, they are cut at the beginning of the tape, washed and then dried by dehydrating them to be cut and packaged. It has many mineral nutrients, fiber, vitamins like C, needed to defend us externally and protein.
